

ORDINANCE NO. 58A

AN ORDINANCE ENACTING A GENERAL PENALTY
ORDINANCE FOR THE VIOLATION OF THE
ORDINANCES OF THE TOWN OF STRATTON.

Whereas, the Board of Trustees has determined that a general penalty ordinance is necessary:

NOW THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE TOWN OF STRATTON, COLORADO, ORDAINS:

Section 1. Violation - Penalty. No person shall violate any of the provisions of the ordinances of the Town of Stratton. Except in cases where a different punishment is prescribed by any ordinance of the town, any person who violates any of the provisions of the ordinances of the Town of Stratton shall be punished by a fine of not more than three hundred dollars, or by imprisonment not to exceed ninety days, or both such fine and imprisonment.

Section 2. Each day deemed a separate offense. Each such person shall be guilty of a separate offense for each and every day during any portion of which any violation of any provision of the ordinances of the Town of Stratton, Colorado, is committed, continued or permitted by any such person, and he shall be punished accordingly.

Section 3. The Board of Trustees finds and declares that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health and safety and, therefore, an emergency exists, and this ordinance, shall be recorded in the Book of Ordinances of the Town of Stratton, Colorado, authenticated by the signature of the Mayor and attested by the Clerk under the corporate seal of the Town and shall be published in "The Stratton Spotlight," a public weekly newspaper published within the corporate limits of the Town of Stratton and the County of Kit Carson and State of Colorado and shall be in full force and effect five days after such publication.
