

ORDINANCE NO. 6-A

AN ORDINANCE ADOPTING THE LEASH LAW AMENDING ORDINANCE NUMBER 98 WHICH ADOPTS THE LICENSING AND IMPOUNDING OF DOGS IN THE TOWN OF STRATTON, COLORADO.

1. The present sections: 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, are renumbered 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, respectively.
2. The following shall be adopted as section 4.

Section 4. PROVISIONS UNDER THE LEASH LAW:

A. It shall be unlawful for any owner, possessor or keeper of any dog in the Town of Stratton to permit the same to run at large within the Town. A dog shall be deemed to be running at large when off or away from the premises of the owner, possessor or keeper thereof and not under the control of such owner, possessor, or keeper or his agent, or servant or a member of his immediate family, either by health, cord or chain, not more than ten feet in length.

Section 5. PENALTY:

A. There will be a fine of five dollars to the owner, possessor or keeper of any dog allowed to run at large in violation of Section 4.

The Board of Trustees finds that an emergency exists and that this ordinance is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public health, wealth, safety, peace and general welfare of the Incorporated Town of Stratton, Colorado and this inhabitants thereof, and shall be in full force and effect five days after the adoption of the same and the publication as required by law.
